The Cedar Rapids Metro Economic Alliance and Greater Iowa City, Inc. annually recommend and support positions on key policy issues affecting our region and state's economic growth. These positions and recommendations are made with significant input from our combined 2,000 members, investors, partners, and community stakeholders.

GOAL: Invest in Talent Development & Regain Educational Leader Status

By creating desirable and robust communities, lowa can establish itself as a great place to live and work. Available housing stock, modern and accessible airports, robust broadband connections, community placemaking projects, and recreational opportunities are vital to lowa's talent attraction and retention strategy and create great "quality of place."

Housing shortages exist throughout the state in both rural and urban areas. We must grow the stock of attainable housing for working households across the region. To retain and attract more workers, lowa can take additional steps to address the shortage through increasing existing tax credits and additional incentives for developers, communities and employers to invest in new and existing housing for all lowans.
