Enhance Community Attraction & Livability Efforts

By creating desirable and robust communities, Iowa can establish itself as a great place to live and work. Available housing stock, modern and accessible airports, robust broadband connections, access to clean and safe water, unique community amenities and recreational opportunities are vital to Iowa's talent attraction and retention strategy and create great "quality of place."

Housing shortages exist throughout the state in both rural and urban areas. We must grow the stock of attainable housing for working households across the region. To retain and attract more workers, Iowa can take additional steps to address the shortage through increasing existing tax credits and additional incentives for developers, communities, and employers to invest in new and existing housing for all Iowans.

Support passage of the Surface Transportation Reauthorization bill to ensure stable funding and streamlined regulations that help states effectively plan and deliver transportation projects in rural and urban areas.	✓	
Support policies and investments that improve Iowa's recreational water quality by strengthening conservation efforts to ensure safe, accessible, and sustainable waterways, and implement the Natural Resources & Outdoor Recreation Trust Fund as originally intended for communities, residents, and visitors.		✓
