Invest in Talent Development & Workforce Growth

To meet workforce needs, Iowa must be a place where skilled workers of all backgrounds choose to live and where young Iowa choose to stay. This will require modernizing immigration policies to fill critical jobs, investing in innovative education and workforce strategies, and aligning PK–postsecondary systems with employer needs through expanded work-based learning opportunities and early skill development. Together, these strategies are essential to retaining and attracting top talent and strengthening Iowa’s workforce today and into the future.

At the same time, removing barriers to work is essential to growing our workforce. Expanding access to affordable child care and investing in underserved communities will close opportunity gaps, strengthen businesses, and boost productivity. Together, these efforts will grow Iowa’s workforce and long-term economic vitality.

Increase funding and eligibility for the Pell Grant and protect the Iowa Tuition Grant so more students have access and options to post-secondary training and degrees for high-demand careers, including expanding access to short-term, job-focused training.	✓	✓
Support policies that are welcoming to all populations to move and remain in Iowa, allowing businesses to attract a diverse workforce and their employees to pay taxes in Iowa.	✓	✓
Support policies that modernize and improve the education funding formula in a way that serves all school districts and students and allows school boards to prioritize their financial resources.		✓
